Jour 1 – Embarquement à Juneau, Alaska

Embarquez à bord de votre bateau avant de prendre la direction de Icy Strait.

Jour 2 – Glacier Bay National Park

Glacier Bay National Park est sur beaucoup de listes 'à voir', c'est également un site classé au patrimoine mondial de l'UNESCO. La contrée étendue de Glacier Bay Outback est un de ces endroits que les gens ont laissé de côté. Dundas & Taylor Bays sont les points les plus austraux dans le parc. Dans la baie le silence règne, mais ce n'est pas moins sauvage pour autant! Partez en kayak et naviguez le long des rochers. N'oubliez pas de scruter les environs à la recherche d'ours et d'aigles. Naviguez dans les Dundas et arrêtez-vous pour une promenade dans la forêt. Pagayez à travers le varech à Taylor Bay avec des phoques qui jouent autour de vous.

Quand vous reviendrez au bateau ca sera déjà l'heure du Happy Hour et le barman aura préparé un 'Old fashioned' pour que vous puissiez raconter vos aventures autour d'un verre avec les autres voyageurs.

### Jour 3 – Glacier Bay National Park

Vous aurez la visite d'un ranger au matin qui vous apportera toute son expertise et vous fera découvrir des lieux inconnus du grand public. N'oubliez pas vos jumelles car South Marble Island est un vrai paradis pour les oiseaux ainsi que d'autres animaux comme des otaries.

### Jour 4 – Chatham Strait / Kuiu island

Il y a beaucoup d'options aujourd'hui, mais le capitaine choisira la meilleure. La forêt nationale de Tongass est une étendue de 240km remplie de grottes mystérieuses. Le long et fin passage de Chatham sépare l'île de Baranof à l'ouest et l'île de Kuiu à l'est. Il y a de la vie sous l'eau, mais également en surface. En kayak, skiff ou paddle board vous pourrez explorer la faune sauvage. Appréciez un verre avec vos camarades de bord au lounge et échangez vos histoires de la journée avant d'aller vous coucher.

### Jour 5 – Kuiu Island

Observez les bancs de saumon le long de la côte...et là où il y a du saumon, il y a des ours! Kuiu à la plus grande population d'ours noirs. Vous pouvez explorer les contrées intemporelles de Saginaw Bay en kayak ou skiff. Repérez les Pygargues grâce à leur tête blanche. Vous pouvez également découvrir Keku ou optez pour une promenade dans la nature encore vierge. Du pur bonheur!

### Jour 6 – Frederick Sound

Pour les baleines à bosse c'est chaque année la fête dans ces eaux riches en krill. La chance est grande qu'après votre petit-déjeuner vous alliez observer les baleines qui mangent le leur! En fonction du temps et du vent il y a plusieurs possibilités pour la journée. Naviguez le long du 'Five Fingers Lighthouse' le plus vieux phare de l'Alaska, situé sur Brothers Island où vous pourrez également observer des otaries. Pagayez plus profondément dans Port Houghton ou Windham Bay ou allez à terre pour une promenade. Au soir levez un toast au magnifique Alaska.

### Jour 7 – Endicott Arm / Fords Terror

Des sommets enneigés, de la glace d'un bleu pur et le son foudroyant de la glace du glacier Dawes qui se brise dans la mer vont vous couper le souffle. Voguez en skiff entre les icebergs que vous ne verrez qu'une seule fois dans votre vie. Avec un œil attentif vous pourrez voir des phoques nager et se reposer sur les blocs de glace. Quand la marée le permet vous visiterez l'entrée de Fords Terror. Au soir profitez du délicieux dîner de fin avec le capitaine pendant que l'équipe d'expédition raconte un résumé de la fantastique semaine passée.

### Jour 8 – Ontschepen in Juneau

Après un délicieux petit-déjeuner avec les autres passagers prenez votre transfert vers l'aéroport de Juneau.





Onboard are kayaks, stand-up paddle boards, skiff explorations, hiking poles, yoga mats, hydrophone for listening to below-surface sounds, and a bow-mounted underwater camera pipes the action to the lounge and to your cabin TV.


The three cabin categories aboard the Wilderness Adventurer: Navigator, Trailblazer, and Pathfinder accommodate singles and doubles.






Sun Deck




Observation Deck
